### **Admission to Sheredes Nursery**

There are 60 places in our Nursery. Places are part time and are for five sessions per week in line with the core offer. Each session lasts 3 hours and will be for either five mornings or five afternoons.

If you are entitled to 30 hours we will be offering this, subject to availability, and on a first come, first served basis. Please see the table below.

Subject to availability, if you are not entitled to 30 hours, but would wish to pay to extend your allocated 15 hours, there will be a charge of £90 for the week, plus a lunch club charge through Sheredes Pre-School. Please see the table below.

### **Fees**

All fees are payable in advance termly. Refunds are not given.

Admission is subject to an application being made and places being available. For the academic year 2022-2023 children will be allocated a place for September.

Admission to the Nursery does not guarantee a place in the Primary school. Applications for Reception must be made on a separate application via Herts County Council.

### **Attendance**

Children can be considered for either a morning or afternoon place term time only. Parents can state a preference but the decision whether to offer a morning or afternoon place lies with the school and is made after careful consideration of all factors.

## **Admissions Procedure**

1. Nursery tours will take place from October through to the end of February. Please ring the school office to book a date.
2. Application forms can be obtained from the school office or on our website. Once completed, the original signed form should be returned to the school office by 4:00pm, 25<sup>th</sup> February 2022.
3. All applications for places in the Nursery will be held by the school and considered between 28<sup>th</sup> February and 4<sup>th</sup> March.
4. Parents will receive a letter of offer in the week beginning 7<sup>th</sup> March.
5. Places will need to be accepted in writing by 17<sup>th</sup> March.

## **Allocation of Places**

If at the application deadline date, there are more places available than there are applications, then all children will be offered a place. After the closing date, the school will continue to offer places, if they are available. Once full, applications will be placed on a waiting list and places will be allocated in accordance with the oversubscription criteria.

## **Oversubscription**

### **Criteria to be used in the event of oversubscription**

1. Government funded places.
2. Children Looked After and previously looked after
3. Children with a sibling at the school, unless the sibling is in Year 6
4. Children for whom it can be demonstrated that they have a particular medical or social need to go to the school
5. Child's nearest school using the HCC website
6. Children living closest to the school (distance) using the HCC website

## **Waiting Lists**

When the Nursery is full, a waiting list will be established in the oversubscription priority order. When places become available, children will be considered from the waiting list. New applications will be added to the waiting list in accordance with the priority order.

## **In Year Admissions**

In Year applications for a place part way through a term will be considered by the Headteacher. If a place is not available, children will be placed on a waiting list.
